Silence game or the exercise of silence

Constant noise can create irritability. Everyone needs moments of peace to rest our bodies and to listen to our thoughts. In order to "make silence", the child must have self-control, they must become aware of everything in their bodies that can move. In a Montessori classroom children are given several tools to help them deal with personal conflicts. One of these tools is a Montessori Peace Table. The Peace Table allows a child to have a short period of silence on their own. There is a Peace Rose on the table that can be used for conflict resolution, through peaceful and respectful communication.

Walking on the line

Between the ages of 3 to 6, the child needs to practice, perfect, and consolidate the body's movements. For this reason, Maria Montessori began using the "Walking on the Line" as a Practical Life exercise. This exercise helps the child control his body, develop balance and to strengthen the mind's control of its body's movements. The "line" used during this exercise is a continuous and permanent shape in the environment. During this exercise, we play some soft, steady, and calm music in the background. Once the lesson has been given, this is a spontaneous individual or group activity.

This month, we studied about the Hubble Space Telescope, which creates the world-famous galaxy images. Science and art are not as far apart as most people think, and the work done with Hubble is a perfect example. We created our own color corrected Hubble image.
