Linda's Class:

We finished our Birds of Prey unit with a very popular project; dissecting owl pellets! Pellets are regurgitated balls of whatever the owl doesn't digest: fur, bones, feathers and teeth. The children then match their findings to a chart to determine what animal the owl ate. Now we're studying rocks and minerals as we identify, smash, paint and polish them this month. You probably saw geode treasures coming home this week! We're also celebrating spring and doing some spring cleaning, starting with our classroom and deck.



Owl pellets are fun - you never know what you'll find! Mostly bones but what kind of bones? Match them to the chart to solve the mystery! Here Moses, Freya, Sylvia, and Heloise concentrate intensely on dissection.
